street, who administered an emetic, and she was sub-
sequently conveyed to Barrington's Hospital, and there
attended by Surgeon Gore, who applied the essential
remedies to counteract the effects of the poison, which
is supposed to have been corrosive sublimate. The poor
woman continues in a very weak state, The Police are
in search of the husband.

On Friday last, as James Barry, a carman, from
Broadfort, near Dromcolloher, was returning from
Cork, he fell off the car near Kanturk, the wheel went
over him, and he was killed on the spot.

John Ryan, of Glenwood, returning from Broadford
on Saturday, was assailed by a party of ruffians who
beat him unmercifully and fractured his skull.

A poor widow named Barrett, mother of four chil-
dren, burst a blood vessel at Newcastle, and in a few
minutes after, life was extinct. Captain Thompson's
company of the 95th Depot, stationed in the town,
made up a sum of money to inter the poor woman, and
to purchase clothes for the children.

Before the Assistant-Barrister, at Quarter Sessions,
on Monday, Mr. S. Bouchier, solicitor, brought an
action, by civil bill, against Mr. R. B. Corneille, pro-

Peter M'Mahon, a carpenter, whose wife's leg had been

had been cautioned of the apparent danger to the

said, there was neglect on the part of Mr. Corneille; and
as the public should be protected from danger, he
would give a decree of £5 against the defendant.
