The late Attorney-General, Mr. Greene, has left for
the Continent, and we regret that the Right Hon.

Mr. Sergeant Murphy, late M. P. for the City Cork,

The funeral of the late Sir Aubrey De Vere, on Thurs-
day last, attracted a vast concourse of persons to
Currah Chase, the family residence, and independent
