## DEATHS.

On Wednesday last, at Kilrush, aged 80 years, James  
Paterson, Esq. This estimable gentleman, who was a native  
of Argyleshire, in 1798 commanded one of the gun-boats then  
protecting the Irish coast from a foreign foe. He subsequently  
settled in Kilrush (of which place, as a mart of trade, he was,  
in a great degree, the founder,) at a period when that now  
large and populous town contained but two or three slated  
houses. He embarked in the mercantile pursuits, which he  
followed with spirit and enterprize for nearly half a century,  
during which time Mr. Paterson was instrumental in circula-  
ting upwards of a million sterling in that locality. He loved  
Ireland with as true a heart as any of her own sons. He car-  
ries with him to his last abode the love and veneration of all  
who knew him.
