MELANCHOLY DEATH OF MAJOR H. BEVAN.—As
Major Henry Bevan, of this city, was returning with
Ensign O'Donnell, 96th, from shooting, on Wednes-
day, near Corofin, his gun accidentally exploded, lodg-
ing its contents in his body, and which killed him on the
spot. He has left a widow, four children, and a nume-
rous and highly respectable circle of relatives and
friends, to mourn this sad event. Major Bevan served
30 years in the East India Company's service, and was
present in all the engagements in the Deccan campaign,
and was author of "Thirty Years in India." He bore
a high character for honor and integrity, as an officer,
and a gentleman; in kindness and benevolence few
were his equals, and he was beloved by all who knew
him.
