REGISTRY OF SCRIP.

To the Provisional Committee, Original Allottees, and Scripholders of the Limerick, Ennis, and Killaloe Junction Railway. GENTLEMEN, THE Committee appointed at the Meeting, held at the office of Mr. Henry O'Shea, Solicitor, on Saturday, the 24th inst., have to state with regret that the Directors have not yet enabled them to ascertain the position of the Company's affairs, while they seem determined on unnecessarily hurrying forward the Registry of your Scrip.

The Committee, in pursuance of the resolutions then entered into, took the necessary steps for obtaining an interview with the Directors, and at the suggestion of Sir David Roche, a special communication was addressed on your behalf to William Fitzgerald, Esq. (in whom it would almost appear that some controlling power lies) respectfully soliciting that he and his Co-Directors would name some early day (and suggesting Thursday, by reason of the approaching registry) for the proposed meeting; but Mr. Fitzgerald has given it as his opinion, that the Directors will act more prudently in not acceding to our request—and the Committee, therefore, apprehend that all their efforts to gain the information you require, before a registry of the Scrip, will prove ineffectual. It should be mentioned that a formal application for a meeting was also addressed to the Directors, on Wednesday morning, and their Secretary was personally requested to communicate it to them without delay.

The Committee feel bound, in justice to some of the Directors to state, that they expressed themselves favorable to the very reasonable application of your Committee for an interview.

The Committee, now finding that they have no prospect of ascertaining the position of the Company's affairs at present, feel it incumbent upon them to state that they have determined not to Register their Scrip on next Monday. They have now resolved upon placing themselves and you entirely under the guidance of eminent counsel, whom they have retained on your behalf, and who has given it as his opinion that the Directors are not bound to Register your Shares as they purpose doing on Monday.
