LIMERICK UNION.—Alderman O'Gorman presided at a weekly meeting of the Guardians this day, when 270 applicants were received, making a total of 2,513 paupers in the house—the weekly cost of each being 2s. 1d. In order to reduce the expenditure, arrangements were made for baking bread for the workhouse, and economical suggestions thrown out by members of the board are to be acted upon, by which a saving of from £3000 to £4000 a-year is expected. There were 23 deaths during the week, and the number sick in hospital, and located in infirm wards is 429.

Dr. John Beveridge, of the Dispensary, was called on after dinner Christmas day, to visit Catherine Cregan, in Bow-lane, who had been taken suddenly ill, and he was not five minutes in the house when she expired. The poor woman had just partook of dinner with her family in apparent good health.
