The death of the young and amiable Mrs. Sampson, whose demise appeared in our obituary on Saturday, and who was but ten months united to her now bereaved husband, was occasioned by a series of frights received during those unhappy agrarian outrages too prevalent in Clare as in other counties. First, when a band of armed ruffians entered her husband's residence at Brook-Lodge, in search of arms, and on another occasion, when the report of the wanton assault on her father, Mr. Walton, and a more recent attack on her husband's property, three of whose horses were shot on their return from Ennis, combined to hasten her illness, and caused her early death.

At the Petty Sessions, on Friday, the Magistrates awarded £10 compensation, to Mrs. Mary Brosnahan, of Boherbuoy, for damage to her property in that locality, by construction of the terminus of the Limerick and Waterford railway.
