There is to be a new election for collector of rates in St. Michael's parish on the 16th inst.

There was a meeting of the Sligo Council on Monday to make application to the Government to have barracks erected there for a full Regiment. The Council also adopted a memorial to the Commissioners of National Education, to have a Model School established there. The great want of the country is industrial knowledge and training.

On Monday, Margaret Costello, of Cappantymore, within three miles of Limerick, died of starvation, and a few days before, Martin Lorigan, of Glengross, within three of this city, of want and starvation. Monday, Luke Ryan, of Kilnacrey, within four miles of Limerick, in the parish of Six-mile-bridge, died of hunger.

An old man named Tom Colgan, well known in the Law Courts of Galway, where he used to act as Interpreter, died from want on Sunday last, and remained three days unburied, not having a coffin.

Two men, brothers, named Killernane, were found dead in their miserable hovel near Carney. These two encountered a lingering death by starvation—they were known as decent, industrious men.

In one small street in the town of Dingle there were eight deaths from dysentery and starvation, on Thursday.

Dr. Davis, of Outerard, near Galway, has very properly contradicted that the pigs had eaten the bodies of five children who died of starvation; and that a poor father buried his daughter in her clothes for the want of a coffin. No such events having occurred.

Ten persons died of starvation in the County Sligo last week.
