John Miller, who received a severe gun-shot in his right arm and shoulder, from a party of men who attacked his house, near Rathkeale, died of the wound on Thursday, in the County Hospital. There was an inquest held on the body. Dr. Gelston proved the cause of death. Verdict—Wilful murder against some persons unknown.

Thursday last Acting Constable Maher, of Ballycahane, arrested Patrick Carroll and two of his sons, on suspicion of sheep stealing. On searching Carroll's house he found the carcass of a sheep, with two lbs. of wool, which was stolen from a farmer named Matthew Eagan, on the previous night. He also found a lot of dead geese and a part of a goat concealed under his bed. Carroll and his sons are earning £1 12s. on the public works, and have 80 stone of wheat at present. There is great praise due to Acting Constable Maher, for his activity in bringing the offenders to justice.

A countryman named Ryan, has been apprehended at Glengare, charged with being of the party that shot Constable Crowley, and attempted to rob Mr. Weyland, Pay Clerk of the Board of Works, near Dundrum last month. The prisoner was severely wounded in the breast, and supposed by one of the two pistol shots fired by Mr. Weyland, as the car drove off.

Saturday night, the cow-house of Mr. John Heffernan, near Charleville, was broken into, and a valuable cow stolen therefrom. Head-Constable Coe succeeded in finding the carcass of a cow concealed in the house of a notorious offender in that town, now in custody; and a cow-hide concealed in a stone wall, which has been indentified by Mr. Heffernan as his property.

On Sunday, at noon, a fine horse belonging to Michael Carroll, of Rhabeg, sub agent to Colonel Westentra, was maliciously stabbed on the pasture.

Two sheep were maliciously killed at Ballydool, near Pallaskenry, on Saturday night, the property of Thomas Lynch.

A cattle jobber, Nicholas Phelan, was stopped on the Anglesea road, near Newport, by two men with their faces disguised, who knocked him down and robbed him of Bank notes, to the amount of £19.

A horse of Mr. Lindsay's, of Fenlog, was fired at on Saturday evening, on the way from Limerick market where he had been with some oats.
