John Miller, who received a severe gun-shot in his right arm and shoulder, from a party of men who attacked his house, near Rathkeale, died of the wound on Thursday, in the County Hospital. There was an inquest held on the body. Dr. Gelston proved the cause of death. Verdict—Wilful murder against some persons unknown.

Thursday last Acting Constable Maher, of Bally-cahane, arrested Patrick Carroll and two of his sons, on suspicion of sheep stealing. The prisoner was severely wounded in the breast, and supposed by one of tha two pistol shots fired by Mr. Weyland, as the car drove off.

Saturday night, the cow-house of Mr. John Heffernan, near Charleville, was broken into, and a valuable cow stolen therefrom. Head-Constable Coe succeeded in finding the carcass of a cow concealed in the house of a notorious offender in that town, now in custody; and a cow-hide concealed in a stone wall, which has been indentified by Mr. Heffernan as his property.

A cattle jobber, Nicholas Phelan, was stopped on the Anglesea road, near Newport, by two men with their faces disguised, who knocked him down and robbed him of Bank notes, to the amount of £19.
