issue an order, this sons employed by their The Lord Lieutenant has sent £10 to John Singleton, Esq., of Quinville, for the two sons of his tenant, Denis O'Neill, as a reward (in the words of his Excellency), for their "valorous conduct" in successfully beating off the assailants who made an attack for arms on their father's house last winter, one of whom the younger son identified, and prosecuted to conviction at the late assizes of Ennis.

As a farmer named Cussen, about three miles from Newcastle, was repairing his fences, he found concealed six sheep skins, some had a part of the wool and others were quite stripped.

A farmer, in the neighbourhood of Newcastle, was robbed of a bond for £100, which he had in his pocket, a few nights ago, by a cyprian.

On Friday, a shopkeper nameed M'Carthy, at Dromcolloher, had his till robbed of £4, by two little girls of the name of Bennis. The money was found hid, and the offenders are in custody.

Thomas White, of Dangan, charged with taking fire-arms from Thomas Sampson, Esq., of Brooke Lodge, was arrested by Constable Higgins, of Quin station, and committed to Ennis gaol by John O'Brien, Esq., S. M. White was employed under the Board of Works near the woods of Cullane when apprehended.

Friday evening a person visited the residence of Thomas Smallman. Esq. of Danielree, within a few miles of Roscrea, and gave a knock, upon which Mr. Smallman went to the door when a shot was discharged at him, but providentially he escaped. The contents struck the hall wall, and the assassin absconded.

On Sunday, a boy, aged 14 years, named John Mahon, was murdered in his father's house, at Longteague, near Stradbally, while the family went out to prayers. The father's desk and box were broken open, and a quantity of silver taken. The servant boy, Price, is committed for further examination.

On Wednesday, a child belonging to a labouring man, Thomas Coll, at Churchtown, Newcastle, was burned in a dreadful manner, by his clothes catching fire. The little fellow lingered for a few hours, when death put an end to his sufferings.

The body of a decently dressed man, name unknown, was washed ashore at Ringmoylan, on Tuesday.
