INSURGENT STATE OF THE COUNTRY.

TWO MURDERS I

THE FATHER AND THE SON.

On Tuesday night, a most barbarous and fatal out-
rage was perpetrated near Heathfield, in this county.
Between seven and eight o'clock, a party of armed
men surrounded the house of a farmer named John
Bennis, steward to property in that quarter, belonging
to Mr. Scanlan. The unfortunate victim of their ven-
geance was at the time surrounded by his wife and
children, but reckless of this affectionate family circle,
they assailed him without hesitation, felled him to the
ground, and while prostrate, one of the miscreants
levelled a gun close to his head, and shot him dead.
Bennis's son and daughter endeavoured to save their
persecuted father from his assailants, but received no
mercy at the hands of the blood thirsty ruffians, who
dragged the unoffending female outside the door,
dashed her to the ground, and, with a refinement of
barbarity, violently stretching her hands, rolled a heavy
laden car across her arms, breaking both wrists!
Not content with this savage outrage the demons
again entered the house, where Bennis' wife was la-
menting over the dead body of her murdered husband.
They struck her with guns on the head, inflicting
serious wound, and left the son almost a lifeless corpse
by his father's side. From the fatal injuries sustained
this youth has since died, and the only cause assiged
for such diabolical atrocity, is that Bennis had served
lattitats for non-payment of rent a few days before.

ANOTHER MURDER.

Wednesday last, between three and four o'clock,
in the afternoon, as Edward Murphy, and John
Nunan, farmers, were walking from Duntryleague
towards Galbally, in this county, two men jumped
out on the road from a field, at a place called
Carrigaroche, and one of them presenting a pistol,
immediately fired at Murphy, and shot him dead on the
spot, the ball having entered his right temple.
His accomplice twice missed fire with another pistol at
Nunan, and then turned off and disappeared. Consta-
ble Hayes, informed of the deadly outrage, from the
survivor, apprehended same evening Patrick Dea,
one of the murderers, who is identified. Charles
Bennett, Esq., Coroner, held an inquest on the
body of Edward Murphy, next day, when a verdict
of wilful murder was returned against Andrew Dea and
Patrick Dea, brothers, the former as the actual mur-
derer of Murphy, the other as present, aiding and assist-
ing therein. Andrew Dea is not yet in custody. These
two men had been ejected from a farm at Duntryleague
and they suspected that Nunan and his brother-in-law,
Murphy, were in treaty to succeed them. This was
"the head and front of their offending."
