FATAL RAILWAY ACCIDENT.—Saturday evening we were informed of a fatal accident which occurred on the Limerick and Waterford railway, at the Cross of Boher, by which it was stated two men were killed on the spot. Upon inquiry we are happy to add that only one man, James Curtin, of New Pallas, met with the untimely fate; but two others, Hayes, of Grange, and Ryan, of Castle-connell, were so severely injured, that they were removed to the County Infirmary, where they continue in a very precarious state. While the workmen were at dinner, it appears that some vile miscreant, knowing that the engine would traverse the line, maliciously placed a broken iron chair upon the rail, which was supported by small stones, convenient to a permanent one sunk in the timber of a sleeper, but so well constructed as to avoid detection. There were eight waggons in advance of the engine, containing from 30 to 40 workmen, and as each met with obstruction, it was upset off the rail, and precipitated about a height of twelve feet. Fortunately the engineer was enabled to check the speed of the engine before the last waggon turned over, else the consequences might have been truly awful. We understand two persons have been arrested on suspicion of being concerned in the atrocious outrage, designed, it is thought, through feelings of revenge consequent upon the reduction of labourers.
