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At a meeting of the Ardahan relief Committee, on Wednesday, the ratepayers attended with a list containing the names of a number of persons who were on the relief lists who had ample means to support themselves and families, and insisted on their names being struck off, as they would not suffer themselves to be robbed. Major Burns called for a scrutiny, which ended in striking off a vast number, an example which should be held up to other committees.

Complaint was made to the Toomevara relief committee on Friday of the rations given out to the poor, the India meal food actually moving with vermin ! Mr. Toohy, the contractor, said he had got it from Limerick, and his correspondent there wrote that "with the exception of the vermin so common to Black Sea corn, the meal was of excellent quality !"

A vessel belonging to Mr. John Delaney, merchant, Sligo, on her voyage homeward from New York, was boarded on Saturday, off Belmullet, by thirty row boats, containing at least 120 men, who, after a short parley with the crew of the brig, plundered her cargo in an effectual manner, having carried off three hundred bags of Indian corn. The vessel was becalmed when the outrage was perpetrated, but fortunately a breeze came on while seven of the marauders were in the hold, when the captain ordered the hatches to be secured, and the delinquents were brought in durance to Sligo, where they were committed for trial.

A ship sailed from Sligo, this week, for Canada, with 200 emigrants, tenants of Sir Robert Gore Booth, who has provided for these adventurers.

To-morrow will be St. Swithin's day, an ominous epoch in the calendar. St. Swithin lived a thousand years ago. He was bishop of Winchester, and priest to King Egbert. He was the deviser and originator of tithes in England. The story runs that, being buried by his own request in the churchyard of the cathedral, the priests a hundred years after commenced the work of translating the remains into the interior. They were stopped by a heavy fall of rain, which lasted forty days, by which time they were convinced that it was designed to stop them, and they gave up the point. Ever since the popular superstition is, that if there be rain on St. Swithin's day, there will be rain for the forty ensuing days.

ROYAL COLLEGE OF SURGEONS IN IRELAND.
Daniel C. Reardon, Esq., eldest son of James Reardon, Esq., of Bottomstown, in this county, having been solemnly and publicly examined on two several days, obtained letters, testimonial qualifying him to practice Surgery. During this young gentleman's examination, he displayed a perspicuity and ability which obtained for him a warm eulogy from his examiners, and which bids fair for his future prosperity in the profession.

The Wicklow copper mine company has declared a dividend of ten per cent. for the last half-year.

The present Lord Lanesborough has applied to the Lord Chancellor to dismiss the receiver on the estate of the late Peer, a lunatic.

Mr. Charles O'Connell, solicitor, of Ennis, is discharged from his arrest at Kilrush Quarter Sessions.

In consequence of the many complaints made by emigrants this season, the magistrates of Cork have resolved to grant no license to any passage broker until approved of at a general meeting of the magistrates, at which the Government Emigration Agent is to attend.

Mr. Edward Farmer, solicitor, is elected chairman of the Mallow Town Commissioners, in room of the late Mr. R. B. Barry.

Saturday the magistrates at Douglas Petty Sessions, Cork, took informations against Mr. George Carr, of the Cork workhouse, for having buried several hundred bodies at Monees, so as to create a nuisance by offensive and dangerous effluvia from the burial ground.

On Monday, a poor woman named Hosty, residing in Tuam, being informed of the death of her daughter in the poor house, dropped off her chair dead.

The governorship of Kilkenny gaol is vacant by the death of Mr. Leigh, a victim to typhus fever.

A cargo of paupers to Cork has come over from England, the first importation under the New Act. They were in a most wretched state ; the Captain of the vessel reports that the majority were out of all the fever hospitals in Liverpool, and the authorities were only waiting for the other patients to be sufficiently recovered to ship them off likewise.

On Friday last, Darby Callanan hung himself at Mil-town Malbay. He was in good pecuniary circumstances, but his habits were that of a miser ; and it is supposed that he took to heart his being plundered of a few pounds by a frail female, whose affections he had coveted.

At the fair of Newcastle, on Monday, there was a tolerable show of stock and some good buyers ; milch cows averaged from £6 to £10 ; strippers £6 10s. to £11 ; two-year olds £4 10s. to £6 10s. ; calves £2 2s. to £3 10s. ; fat sheep 30s to 40s ; store sheep from 25s to 30s ; lambs 10s. to 15s ; store pigs 18s to 30s.
