In the Dublin Bankrupt Court, on Friday, an appli-
 cation was made by Mr. Levy, for the discharge of the
 bankrupt, Cornelius Hickey, of Ennis, who had been
 committed to prison by Mr. Macan, for answering unsat-
 isfactorily with regard to the alleged loss of £600, by
 a fire in his closet. Mr. Levy moved, on a medical
 certificate, that further detention would be attended
 with danger to his life. The Court decided on making
 an order for his release.

John Long, a labourer, fell off the gable main wall o

 and died soon after in hospital of fracture and other
 injuries.
