A scene of a melancholy and very nigh fatal nature was witnessed on Thursday morning at a house on Arthur's quay. Before retiring to rest the night before, the gas in the shop was extinguished as usual by the proprietor, but subsequently, through some unexplained circumstance, the main cock was turned on full, while the burners remained open. Immediately over the shop was a sleeping apartment occupied by four young females named Hannah and Mary Mahony, Anne M'Namara, and Anne Parker. During the night the escape of gas penetrated the apertures, and filled the room, and one of the sleepers having awoke, felt the stupyling effluvia, which gradually overpowered her as she strove to rise and leave the room. She staggered and fell upon the floor, while the other three remained a sleep. In this fearful state they continued until day break, when a young girl, passing down the stairs heard moaning in the apartment, upon which she gave the alarm, and immediately the room door was burst in, by a soldier of the 88th, who was billeted on the quay, and the four females were discovered quite unconscious, and to all appearance lifeless. They were removed into the open air, and restoratives attempted, but to no purpose, until Dr. Gelston and Mr. Byfield, of the Medical Hall, visited the sufferers, when proper remedies were applied, and symptoms of animation became apparent. The sufferers were conveyed to Barrington's hospital, where Dr. Gelston remained in attendance, and before twelve d'clock he had the satisfaction of pronouncing them dut of danger, and they were in the afternoon enabled to leave for their home.

A young woman, who had not long been united to her second husband, John Ryan, having died in Market Alley, on Thursday, under circumstances rather susnicious, as they did not cohabit for some weeks, and when it was found that the corpse swelled so much that the body could not be placed in the coffin, her neighbours apprehended the woman must have died the victim of poison, and a report was made to the Police, when an inquest was determined upon, and accordingly Dr. Enright, coroner, impanuelled a jury in St. Mary's Church-yard, on Thursday, the day after the tuneral, when the lid of the coffin was raised, and after the examination of Dr. Russell, her medical attendant, a verdict was returned that the woman died of inflammation of the bowels, induced by natural causes, thus removing an injurious suspicion of her late husband.
