**YOUNG IRELAND MEETING.**—The members of the Sarsfield Confederation Club held their first public meeting this day, at the Theatre, Henry-street, William S. O'Brien, Esq. M. P., in the chair, who opened the proceedings by explaining the objects for which the club had been founded. He was followed by the proposers and seconders of the different resolutions, viz:— Doctor William Griffin, Hamo De Massy, Esq., J.P., Doctor Daniel Griffin, Rev. Mr. M'Mahon, P.P. Doonass; Mr. Richard O'Gorman, Alderman O'Hara, Mr. John O'Donnell, Solicitor; Mr. Patrick Lynch, Solicitor; Mr. Kearns, of Ardfert; Mr. James R. Browne. There was a platform constructed on the stage for the accommodation of the speakers, who were loudly cheered by the auditory, which did not exceed 300 persons, including several ladies who occupied seats in the boxes. A large crowd of spectators assembled in the vicinity of the theatre, and notwithstanding the vigilance of the police, a few of the "Young Irelanders" were assaulted, amongst them Mr. J. Corbett, Dr. Kidd, Mr. Hayes, of Rathkeale, and Mr. O'Connell, of Lock-quay, when leaving the place of meeting. It was six o'clock when the chair was vacated by Mr. S. O'Brien, whose place was filled by Mr. Hamo de Massy, but it being contrary to the principle of the Confederates to return thanks to any member for his services, the usual ceremony was dispensed with as to both chairmen. Mr. John O'Donnell, Solicitor, was escorted home by the Police.

We deeply regret to have to announce the death of Lieut.-Col. John Dickson of the County Limerick Regt. of Militia, at his house in George's-street, on yesterday, after a tedious illness which he bore with great patience and exemplary resignation to the will of his Divine Master.
