An unfortunate poor man of the name of Shinners, from Ballybrood, died on Sunday in a field near a farmer's house in that perish, for want of the necessaries of life. The estate of Sonwell, county Tipe he estate of Sopwell, county Tipperary, within seron

miles of Birr, was sold yesterday, under a decree of Chancery. The estate comprises 5,688 acres, and is set for a net yearly income of £943—not quite 5s. per acre. In May last the sale was postponed on account of insufficient hiddings; not more than £12,500 baving been then offered; yesterday, it was concluded at a price of £17.000 only.

All the stock of the late Major Mahon at Strokestown demesne is to be sold off without reserve.

Thursday last Mr. Abernathy, who acis for the receiver appointed by the Courts, accompanied by fifteen bailiffs, proceeded to the lands of Carrig, Lower Ormond, county Tipperary, for the purpose of making distresses for reat; on their appearance they were assailed by a mob with yells and groans, and driven off the lands without making a single seizure. Mr. Aberpathy ludged informations in order to warrant the magistrates to afford him protection to distrain the lands. The necessary documents have been forwarded by Mr. E.P. Ryan, R. M., Portumna, to Government, as no protection can be given without the sanction of the

A party of five armed men effected an entrance into the house of Mr. William Galbraith, at Ballybritt, on Wednesday evening. Three of the party had their faces They broke open a box where Mr. Galbraith was keeping his fire-arms, and carried away his gun. Fortunately he had lent his pistois to a friend a few days before. Upwards of twenty persons ricen a rew cays before. Upwards of twenty persons have been seen lately at night on Ballybritt mountain, all of whom were armed. They were firing shots.

Sunday night an armed party of seven men diaguised, entered the house of Patrick Ryan, of Barna-

grove, and searched the house for money and arms. On finding neither they heat Ryan and his son in a most cruel manner with the butts of their guns, inflicting severe wounds on the elder Ryan.

Tuesday evening, four men, well armed, attacked the pound keeper's house at O'Brien's Bridge, and after swearing him to produce a decree which he got with some stock which were impounded for rent they took od scrubbing, at per dozen. it fired a blunderbuss and walked away

Thursday evening, the body of a female child was found sewed up in a bag on the banks of the canal near Killsloe.
