At a meeting of the Irish Relief Association in Dublin,
Lord Roden in the chair, it was resolved to discontinue
the benevolent operations of the committee for the
next two months, the balance in hand being so small,
but not to discontinue the association, as it is apprehended
they will have to resume with additional funds after
that period.

An unfortunate poor man of the name of Shiners,
from Ballybrack, died on Sunday in a field near a far-
mer's house in that parish, for want of the necessities
of life. An inquest was held by the coroner, Mr. Hen-
nett, and a verdict returned accordingly. The wretched
victim of destitution has left three little children, with-
out any means of subsistence.

The Limerick and Dublin mail givers states that
the Limerick postbag, which the Annuity office found,
was blown out of his hands upon the road by a gale of
wind, on Monday evening, and that the Castle-coined
bag was delivered by him quite safe.

The estate of Sappell, county Tipperary, within seven
miles of Birt, was sold yesterday, under a decree of Chan-
cery. The estate comprises 5,688 acres, and is set
for a net yearly income of 2948—not quite 5s. per acre.
The sale of the said estate was postponed on account of in-
sufficient bidders; not more than £2,500 having been
then offered; yesterday, it was concluded at a price of
£17,000 only.

All the stock of the late Major Mahon at Strokes-
low, is to be sold off with reserve.

Thursday last Mr. Abernathy, who acts for the
receiver appointed by the Courts, accompanied by fif-
teen bailiffs, proceeded to the Lands of Carrig, Lower
Ormond, county Tipperary, for the purpose of making
distresses for rent; on their appearance they were as-
sailed by a mob with yells and grunts, and driven off
the lands without making a single seizure. Mr. Abern-
athy lodged informations in order to warrant the ma-
trons to afford him protection to distrain the lands.
The necessary documents have been forwarded by Mr.
E. P. Ryan, R. M., Portlanna, to Government, as no
protection can be given without the sanction of the
Executive.

A party of five armed men effected an entrance into
the house of Mr. William Galbraith at Ballybritt, on
Wednesday evening. Three of the party had their faces
blackened. They broke open a box where Mr. Gal-
braith was keeping his fire-arms, and carried away his
gun. Fortunately he had lent his pistols to a friend
a few days before. Cynards of twenty persons
have been seen lately at night on Ballybritt mountain,
all of whom were armed. They were firing shots.

Sunday night an armed party of seven men dis-
guised, entered the house of Patrick Ryan, of Baran-
nagh, and searched the house for money and arms.
On finding neither they beat Ryan and his son in a
most cruel manner with the butts of their guns, in-
flicting severe wounds on the elder Ryan.

Tuesday evening, four men, well armed, attacked the
young widow's house at Officree's Bridge, and after
swearing him to produce a decree which he got with
some stock which were impounded for rent they took
it fired a blunderbuss and walked away.

Thursday evening, the body of a female child was
found lying in a bog on the banks of the canal near
Kilshille. A verdict of murder against some person or
persons unknown was returned at the inquest.

A fine young horse, the property of Mr. Thady
Hogan, of Smithstown, Newmarket-on-Fergus, was
shot dead on return from the Limerick market.

John F. Bourke, Esq. Coroner, accompanied by Sub-
Inspector Wake and a party of police, proceeded to the
island of Inishurk, coast of Mayo, to hold an inquest
on the body of Ellen Toole. Deceased having been
observed to be unwell, the jury returned a verdict
a verdict of wilful murder against John Toole, the
woman's husband, and Patrick Toole, her brother in
law, for aiding and abetting. An unfortunate woman
