The Jury returned a verdict "That the deceased, Ralph Hill, came by his death, at Rathurd, in the county of Limerick, on the morning of the 18th inst., having been wilfully murdered, by gun-shot wounds, infleted by some person or persons to us unknown."

In the afternoon the remains of Mr. Hill were conveyed from the Infirmary to his residence, in Clarestreet, followed by sorrowing friends.

The funeral of Mr. Hill took place this morning, when a numerous and respectable cortage followed the remains to the church-yard, at Killalee.

An order was received this day from his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant, for the Ordnance waggons to proceed to Rathure to bring in the corn of Quain's family, distrained by the late Mr. Ralph Hill, as the carmen of this City refused to be employed in the service. The distraint will be removed to town under escort of military and police this afternoon.

The distraint, consisting of a quantity of barley, was this day removed to town, and deposited in the stores of Mr. H. N. Seymour, Rutland-street. The following military force were in attendance :- Half Troop 1st Dragcon Guards, under Lieut. Gough; 140 rank and file of the 41st Regiment, under Major Carpenter, Capt Wells, Lieuts. Wetherall and Rawlins, Ensigns Bertram and Dickson. The Magistrates officially engaged were, Messrs. Barron, Crips, and Tabiteau.

ANOTHER MURDER!

Mr. Daniel Dillon, a wealthy farmer, was waylaid within a furlong of his residence at Cappamore, last evening, and brutally murdered. His assailants literally stoned their victim to death, and cleft his head with a hatchet. The deceased had decreed several persons indebted to him at the late Quarter Sessions, and hence it is supposed the fatal vengeance. Dillon has left a young wife, and several children. His general character was that of a prudent, industrious man. It is ascertained that four men committed this atrocious outrage, and within less than haif a mile of a Police station.

The agent of Arthur Evans, Esq. collecting rents on the Townland of Donoughmore, near this city, on Thursday, was hunted off the lands by a mob, who swore they would destroy him if he did not quit.

Thursday night at an early hour, eight armed fellows entered the house of the steward of John S. Browne, Esq. near the Commons of Rathkeale, and not getting fire-arms, beat the faithful man severely, left him as they supposed for dead.
