Patrick Cleary, who on the 6th inst. was fired at on
his way from this city to Broadford, died on Mon-
day of lock jaw, the result of the fatal wound in
his breast. It is remarkable that this unfortunate
man was shot in mistake for a policeman in co-
loured clothes. Yesterday Dr. Enright, coroner, held
an inquest on his body, and a verdict of wilful
murder was returned against Michael Butler, as prin-
cipal, and Mathew Hourigan, as accessories, both
committed to Ennis gaol. Dr. Gelston was examined
to prove the fatal nature of the wound in his left breast.
The day of the outrage Cleary identified the two aggres-
sors above named, and his subsequent depositions were
taken by William Roche, Esq. of this City, the magis-
trate who attended his dying bed.

Head Constable Daly, of this city, and Constable J.
Cronin, of Galbally, arrested at Liverpool, on Friday
last, Andrew Dea, a principal in the barbarous murder
of the late Edmond Murphy, at Duntryleague, and of
which a brother of Dea's was capitally convicted last
Assizes. The prisoner was brought in custody to
Limerick on Monday last. It is worthy of note that
Inspector Williams apprehended this very runaway
upon suspicion of the same murder about a fortnight
since in this city, but he was then discharged for want
of identification.

On Sunday night, five armed men visited the dwell-
ing of Michael Kilmartin, and having forcibly effected
an entrance, fired shots and found a double barrel gun,
with which they decamped.

Two fine sheep, the property of William P. Poe, Esq.
were killed on the lands of Donnybrook, on Sunday
night, and the carcasses taken away.

Wednesday last, the drivers of Mr. Williams were
robbed of the price of two loads of wheat, on their
return from Cloughjordan.

In the County Galway sheep-killing and stealing are
rapidly on the increase. Near Monksfield a quantity
of mutton has been found in a man's cabin, 11 sheep's
heads in his garden together with some wooland skins;
and at Raheen five sheep were killed.

On Wednesday night two men named Larkin—
father and son—were badly wounded by a gang of
ruffians, while defending their house, which they had
assailed in search of his daughter. The scene of this
outrage is two miles from Banagher.

Three men have been arrested for the murder of
Patrick Frawley lately near Ennis.

Thomas Callaghan, the steward of Charles Mahon
Esq. of Craghbrien, was severely beaten by a party of
men who waylaid him on his way home on Friday
evening from Ennis, near Newhall.

On Wednesday night several countrymen left town
for the West, armed with muskets and fowling pieces,
which some of them brandished with shouts and gesti-
culations.—*Cork Constitution.*
