A poor man named William Bayle, of Doon, fell in
to the canal on Monday night, and would have perished
but for the humane exertions of Mr. Ralph Nash,
aided by Sub Constable Nash, city police, and others,
who dragged him out in almost a lifeless state.

On this day, a person named Honora Holohan, (ad-
mitted into the County Infirmary, on the recommen-
dation of Lady Anna Maria Monsell,) had a cancerous
breast removed by Dr. Gelston, in presence of Dr.
White, Inspector-General of Lunatic Asylums, and
several medical men attached to the Institution.
The patient was placed under the influence of Chloro-
form, and after five or six inspirations, total insensibi-
lity being produced, the operation was proceeded with,
and the diseased gland, weighing over 12½ ounces, re-
moved; and, after sensibility being restored, she ex-
pressed herself as having been completely unconscious
of pain. This is the first instance of the successful use
of Chloroform, in surgical operation, in this city, and
amply proves the valuable boon thus conferred on
surgical science.

Margaret M'Mahon, aged 12 years, living in Mary
street, admitted into Barrington's hospital the week
after Christmas, having suffered a very extensive burn
of the face, arms, and body, while placing a saucepan
of water on the fire, when her clothes ignited, died
on Monday last from the effects of the injury.
