DUBLIN CORN EXCHANGE—TUESDAY.

There was more grain at this day's market than has appeared for some time. Prime qualities supported the prices of last week, but middling and inferior descriptions were rather lower. Indian corn met a dull sale at a small reduction in price.

LONDON CORN EXCHANGE—MONDAY.

The arrivals of Wheat of home produce up to our market last week, coastwise, exceeded 6,000 quarters. Those of all other kinds of English grain, as well as Flour, were small. A few Oats came to hand from Ireland and Scotland; while the imports from abroad consisted of 15,533 quarters of Wheat, 1,300 ditto of Barley, 2,385 ditto of Oats, 2,376 ditto of Beans. No Foreign Flour came to hand. Fresh up this morning, a fair average quantity of English Wheat reached us from Essex and Kent. The weather having become seasonably fine—a sharp frost having been experienced to-day—the condition of the samples on offer was considerably improved, owing to which, and the increased attendance of buyers, the demand for all kinds of English Wheat was steady, at fully, but nothing quotable beyond, the prices obtained on Monday last, and at which a good clearance was effected by the factors.
