

A correspondent at Templemore, signed "*Nunquam Dormio*," complains of the conviction of two officers of the 55th by the local Bench for trespass in search of game upon Sir John Carden's estate, upon the evidence of those persons, who had previously charged a Major of the 59th with same offence, but who was at the very time sworn to upon duty in the barracks. The case against this officer was dismissed, yet that against the others, resting on the very same testimony, was admitted to be good.

Hill, have been properly appreciated by Government, who sent him down £30, as a testimonial of their approbation of his conduct.

Lieut. Peregrine Bowen, R.N., of Liverpool, charged with forging a will for his brother, who died in China, committed suicide in the Compter prison, London, on Tuesday, by hanging himself from the iron gratings of the window. The unfortunate officer commanded the Princess mail steamer between Dublin and Liverpool. One of his brothers was formerly Major 67th Regt.

**FOUR MEN DROWNED.**—The brig Shannon arrived from Ibrail, with bread stuffs for Cochrane & Argles, on Thursday put out her boat with Capt. Caldbeck, four of the crew, and a river pilot, to bring up the vessel's papers to the broker and consignees. The captain remained in this city, and sent back the same hands with the boat, but they had unfortunately, taken an over quantity of grog, and raising a lug sail on the craft, to spare the labour of rowing, the boat was upset by mismanagement near Grass island, when four of the five perished, by an untimely death. Reuben Simons is the only survivor of his shipmates, and contrived by swimming, and supporting himself occasionally by one of the oars, to keep himself over water. The names of the unfortunate men drowned are, Patk. Cahill, pilot, John Redmore, second mate, John Quigley, seaman, and Thomas Rae, apprentice. One of the bodies was yesterday washed ashore at Grass Island.
