

ELECTION OF GUARDIANS AT LIMERICK.

This is the last day of putting Guardians in nomination. Voting papers will be opened on the 18th inst.; on the 20th inst. they are to be collected; and on the 23d inst. Mr. O'Connor, the returning officer, will declare the elected guardians, whose number is 34, viz.:—for the electoral divisions of Limerick, including Thomond, John-street, Patrick-street, William-street, Richmond-place, North suburb, and South suburb wards; Patrickswell, Crecora, Fedamore, Ballybricken, Kilmurry, Caherconlish, Cappamore, Doone, Murroe, Abington, Castle-Connell, Kiltannonlea, Kilokenedy, Kilsceely, Kilfenaghta, Killeely, Derrygalvin, and Mungret.

LIMERICK HARBOUR COMMISSONERS.—William Roche, Esq., presided at a meeting of the board on Thursday, but no business was transacted beyond making arrangements with Mr. Laurensen, contractor for erecting the floating docks, relative to quarry right at Mount-kennett.
