A new Roman Catholic church at Clifford, near Tadcaster, was opened by Doctor Wiseman, on Wednesday last.

At the fair of Rathkeale on Thursday fat cows rated from £8 to £14 10s; Eyre Massy, Esq. of Glanduff Castle, sold a lot at £14; milch cows rated from £7 to £12; strippers £5 10s to £9; two year olds £4 to £6; calves £2 5s to £3 15s; fat sheep £1 10s to £2 2s; lambs 7s to 15s; bacon pigs scarce, from 50s to 55s per cwt.; store pigs from £1 8s to £2 10s.

At Galway fair sheep were very few, and prices looking up beyond those obtained at Loughrea. Black cattle also fetched 8s or 10s per head beyond prices at other recent fairs. Milch cows varied in price from £6 to £10.
