TO THE EDITOR OF The Limerick Chronicle.

DEAR SIR,
MY attention being directed to an article which appears in the *Limerick Reporter* of last evening, and which purports to be a report of a portion of the proceedings in the Insolvent Court held in this city the previous day—in referring to the case of O'Brien, late Grocer and Hotel-keeper, an Insolvent, which came on for hearing, the article states the Insolvent was remanded for fraud, in order to give time and opportunity to prosecute him and his attorney, Mr. Wellington Evans. Why my name should be thus wantonly connected with the Insolvent's affairs, I am at a loss to know, "not being his attorney," and of course know nothing of his dealings towards his creditors. The only occasion upon which I ever professionally acted for Mr. O'Brien was about 18 months ago, when he sent his medical attendant for me to prepare his will, himself being confined to his sick bed at the time. I waited upon him, attended in his sick chamber for several days, arranging his property (which at that time he led me to believe was ample) pursuant to his instructions, principally for the benefit of his wife and daughter—he representing that his son was an undutiful bad boy, and that his sole wish was not to leave his wife and daughter depending upon him. Having done my duty, as a professional man, by arranging his affairs according to his wishes,—from that period to the present I had no further professional intercourse with Mr. O'Brien,—nor even have I received one shilling as payment for all my trouble, loss of time, and cash out of pocket, on the occasion alluded to. He is still my debtor, and I fear is likely to remain so.

Such is a brief statement of my connection with Mr. O'Brien, and I trust the public will see that I have every reason to complain, and seek redress for the unenviable position in which the Proprietor of the *Limerick Reporter* has introduced my name in his newspaper report of this case.
