

DEATH OF MRS. ROBERT MAUNSELL.

On Monday night, at her house in George street, aged 83 years, Mrs. Anne Maunsell, relict of the late Robert Maunsell, Esq. Bank Place. Through a life prolonged beyond the usual boundary of mortality, this lady preserved the esteem of all who came within the sphere of her influence, and the fond affection of a numerous and most respectable family. In the domestic circle her duties were always discharged with the utmost kindness, suavity, and gentleness; and the deep regret which her children and relatives feel for her loss can only be assuaged by the remembrance of her estimable qualities and the certainty of her having exchanged earth for Heaven. Her charity was unbounded and unostentatious, and many a child of sorrow and afflicted never appealed to her in vain. The public institutions also shared largely in her bounty, for there was no benevolent object proposed to which she did not willingly contribute. As her life, so was her departure—calm, peaceful, and abounding in hope. She lived a true Christian after the image of Him who has left us an example that we should walk in His steps, and yielded up her spirit to Him as into the hands of a faithful Creator. Mrs. Maunsell was mother of our respected High Sheriff, Henry Maunsell, Esq. Colonel Fred. Maunsell, late 85th Regt. Leut. Col. George Maunsell, late 3d Dragoons, and grandmother to the Countess of Seafield. One of her daughters also is the beloved wife of Eyre Evans, Esq. of Ashill Towers, and also mother to the amiable Hon. Mrs. Massy. Her remains will be interred in the family vault at St. John's Church on Friday.
