No order has yet been received at the county gaol to admit to bail Mr. Wm. F. Hartnett, of Newcastle, the only prisoner there in custody for a political offence.

In order to prevent poaching, and afford protection to such gentlemen as hold game licenses, the "watchers" of Excise are now on the alert in this city and county, for the purpose of prosecuting all persons found infringing upon the law, under pretext of being licensed "to keep and carry fire arms."

Messrs. J R Barry and William Fennell, Commissioners of Fisheries, are on a tour through the south of Ireland, to fix the boundaries of the different districts under the late act of Parliament, for the election of conservators.

Catherine Roohan, aged five years, was burnt to death in Coloony-street, on Wednesday night, her clothes having ignited at the fire-place, in the absence of the mother.

An order of readiness has been received for the removal of the City gaol convicts to Spike Island depot, and the Smithfield Penitentiary.

Thomas Kiely, a labourer, employed adjusting main pipes in the streets, was conveyed to Barrington's hospital in a dangerous state on Thursday evening, having been nearly suffocated by a sudden escape of gas from an aperture in a tube which he was soldering.

In Cork the prisoners confined under the Habeas Corpus Suspension act are all liberated, with the exception of Mr. Denny Lane and Mr. William Pennington.

Mr. Blake and Mr. Butler, the proprietor and the editor of the *Vindicator*, were discharged yesterday from Galway gaol, having given bail in the sum of £100 each, and two sureties in £50 respectively.

The Dean of Armagh is making great agricultural improvements on his estates in the county of Cork.

Government are again importing provisions into this country for the relief of the destitute in those districts where local assistance might be inadequate. The *Adventure*, from Plymouth, has arrived in Cork with 700 casks of India corn meal for that purpose.

At Killinick petty sessions, Wexford, the informations of Sir Hugh Palliser against John Howlin, Esq. for malicious trespass and removal of manure, were refused by the bench. Robert H Hunt, Esq. agent of Sir Hugh, having during the discussion applied the word falsehood to Mr. Howlin, that gentleman swore an information of the fact to ground an application to the Queen's Bench, as Mr. Hunt would not retract the obnoxious epithet.

Thirty-six men and women, convicted at Mallow sessions, were lodged in Cork gaol on Wednesday.
