**MURDER.**—Thomas Nicholson, from Cappamore, was waylaid on Sunday evening last, and severely beaten while bringing home his brother who had been a patient in the County Infirmary. The above Thomas was brought into the County Infirmary on Tuesday, with a broken head and other wounds, of which he died on Thursday evening, and at the inquest yesterday, Dr. Gelston, in whose ward he was, explained the cause of his death. Parties of the name of "Ryan Luke," are accused of the murderous outrage, and a verdict of willful murder was returned against the father and two sons whom Nicholson's surviving brother recognised.

Edward Kelly was way laid and nearly beat to death near Clogh Jordan on Friday, by three men who demolished almost every feature, eye, nose and teeth.

Constable Jackson, of Patrick's-well station, a very efficient Policeman in that district, arrested on Saturday last, Timothy Savage and William M'Carthy, in the act of passing base coin, and on searching the prisoners, he found in their possession a quantity of bad money, with materials used for coining. After the discovery was made, Constable Jackson despatched Sub-constable Allen to the district of Ballingarry, where the parties resided, and on searching two or three houses, the policeman (Allen) discovered a variety of coining implements used some base metal, and bad coin, with bank notes to the amount of £9. supposed to be forgeries. Ballingarry appears to be the favorite abode of a numerous gang of coiners, whose operations have, for some time, proved "beneficial to their own interests," as an unlimited number of forged notes of the Bank of Ireland have been successfully circulated through the country. Sub-constable Allen took into custody John and Julia Donoghue, of Gurtroe, Morty Lynch, Clouncappa, and Michael Feehan, of Feehonagh, as principals.

On Sunday night, a house on the lands of Lisduff, near Ballycoric, was maliciously set on fire, and burned to the ground.

Two stacks of corn were maliciously burned down in the haggart of Michael M'Carthy, of Killonihan, on Saturday night last.
