ANOTHER MURDER!

Thomas Madigan, of Cappa, deputy collector of grand jury cess for the barony of Lower Connelloe, under Mr. Hugh Massy, of Stoneville, was waylaid and brutally murdered, when on his way home, through the commons of Ratlikeale, on Monday night. The mangled body of the unfortunate victim, when found by the police, presented a horrifying appearance, his brains having been knocked out, and his features dreadfully shattered. Madigan was an elderly man, and has left a large family to deplote his loss. No reason can be assigned for the perpetration of the bloody deed, as deceased was a harmless man, and at all times mild in the discharge of his duty.

That efficient officer, Head Constable Power, of Kilrush, from private information, succeeded, after a harassing search through the mountains, on Friday night last, in arresting Wm, Kelly, Patrick Considine, and Larry Malone, who have been fully identified as the perpetrators of the brutal murder of Anthony Murphy, at Cloughanmore, on the night of the 1st inst., as reported in our last publication.

Sunday night a party of armed men, with their faces blackened, attacked the dwelling house of a respectable farmer named Normyle, residing at Duckstown, within a mile and a half of Rathkeale. Having been refused admittance, the whiteboys demanded money, which Normyle told them they would nt get, whereupon they smashed the windows, and fired two shots at Normyle, one of which wounded him in the breast. The ruffians finding they could not gain access to the house, deliberately set it on fire at both ends of the thatch, after which they decamped, but not until they kept guard

for them. Sunday last, Mr. Cox, Coroner for the district, held an inquest on the body of Thomas M'Cartliy, who died of a fractured skull, in consequence of a fall at Mr. Guerin's house, in Newcastle. Verdict accordingly.
