There are 2100 paupers being maintained in the Rathkeale union workhouse, and over 10,000 in receipt of out door relief.

The Attorney-General has filed a bill for the sale of the Dublin Corporation estates, to make good £187,000 alleged misapplication of the pipe-water estate.

This day, Private Grimsly, of the 3d Buffs, was sentenced by Regimental Court Martial, at the prosecution of Mr. Browne, the active Inspector of St. Michael's parish night watch, to pay a fine of *one penny*, for 365 days, for being drunk in the streets, on Thursday night, and assaulting the Inspector. Mr. Browne also prosecuted Private Cooke for similar offence, and he was sentenced to 14 days solitary confinement, with the loss of four days pay.

LIMERICK UNION.—Alderman Wallnutt presided at a meeting of the guardians this day, when the following resolution, proposed by Wm. Monsell, Esq. M. P., and seconded by Samuel Maunsell, Esq. was passed without any discussion:—"That our funds are at present exhausted; that the great and unexpected pressure on the rates, arising from the increase of the numbers requiring relief, and the expense of the new buildings which we have been forced to erect, have disturbed our calculations, and prevented us from having that sum of money on our hands, notwithstanding all our exertions to enforce payment of the rates, which we expected to have at this period. That notwithstanding all these difficulties we are determined to show a willingness to meet the just demands of the Treasury; that we, therefore, borrow (as by a sealed tender already received from the Commissioners, we have a right to do so), a sum of £2021 15s 9d, and forthwith transmit it as an instalment of our debt, until the assurance that no exertions on our parts shall be wanting to provide for the repayment of another portion of our debt to the Treasury at an early period. And that a cheque on the Treasurer be drawn accordingly:—Patrickswell, £781 6s 9d; Derrygalvin, £687 7s 6d; Ballybricken, £553 1s 6d. The Clerk stated that the Assistant Master of the Union Workhouse, would resign office on Monday, having been engaged for another situation. The majority of the board expressed regret at losing so active an officer, and it was proposed to nominate Mr. Thomas Palmer, *pro tem* to discharge the duties, should Mr. Hackett follow up his intention. The Rev. Mr. Darrac, R. C. Chaplain of Boherbuoy auxiliary workhouse, reported that 320 children were without milk for breakfast this morning; 260 yesterday, and 310 on Thursday. The Clerk was directed to enquire into the neglect. Number of persons in receipt of out door relief, 5,300; paid during week, to same, £172 6s 11d.
