At an inquest held in the neighbourhood of Abbeyfeale on the body of Catherine Sullivan, before John Cox, Esq., on Wednesday, David Cahill deposed that he brought deceased into his house on Saturday evening, and he went out at dawn on Sunday morning; when he came home on Sunday she was dead. Mary Cahill deposed she saw the deceased by the ditch side, on Friday night; she asked for God sake to give her a drink; gave her a basin of water, and at the break of day, next morning, she was in the same spot; Julia Murphy gave her gruel and new milk; did not see her eat anything; she had about a pound of dry Indian meal in a little bag; Mr. Smyth, the relieving officer, gave sixpence for her; on Saturday evening, the day before she died, she said that was the only relief she got; she had awful thirst; she would drink a can full, but it used to come out of her mouth; she had no bowel complaint. The jury, David Leahy, foreman, declined giving their verdict in this case without a *post mortem* examination, which the coroner, not deeming it necessary, would not allow.

Dr. Enright, of Glin, and John Cox, Esq. coroners for the county, held inquests in the districts of Athea and Abbeyfeale, from the 6th of December, 1848, to the 7th of February inst.—Mary Keleher, verdict, died of disease of the heart; Michael Connell, died of starvation; John Gleeson, verdict, natural death; Maurice Connell, verdict, died of starvation; John Sullivan, died of starvation; Patrick Dillane, died of starvation; David Smarks died by the visitation of God; Catherine Sullivan, no verdict. There was a *post mortem* examination on five of the above by Dr. Ambrose.

Dr. Enright, Coroner, was obliged to fine two absent jurors 40s each for contempt of summons, and non attendance at the inquest this week, upon the late Capt. Hingant, of the Camelius.

An inquest was held this week at Birr upon the body of Denis Kelly, a labourer, who had taken 20 drops of chloroform in a bottle ordered by Dr. Wallace, a young Scotch Surgeon, and whose prescription was made up by his assistant, who was unqualified, and could not read the prescription. The jury found that the man died suddenly, and censured the Doctor.

A poor man of the name of Donoghue was drowned at Miltown Malbay this week, by the reflux of a large wave, while gathering shell fish.

Mrs. Elizabeth Becher has commenced a suit in the Cork consistorial court for divorce from her husband, Michael Adam Becher, for cruelty and adultery.
