The Lord Lieutenant has ordered the liberation of
133 prisoners from Cork gaol.

Ninety prisoners under sentence of confinement for
larcenies, were discharged from Galway gaol on Wed-
nesday, by order of the Lord Lieutenant.

Six hundred acres of Crown lands in the county
Roscommon are to be sold this month by the Woods
and Forests board.

At the Court of Conscience, on Wednesday, the
collector at Blackboy preferred a charge against Mr.
Hill, for toll of goods conveyed by the railway, the
Mayor declined hearing the complaint, as being Lessor

Return of Cholera patients, received into Barring-
tons' hospital, since the appearance of the disease, on
Monday:—Martin Boyle (died,) Mary Mannix, James
Burns, Jane Connors (died) Mary King, (died) Francis
Duggan (died) Johanna Young (died) Catherins
Collins (died) Mary Burns (died) John Finucane,
(died) Anne Woulfe, Myles Molony, Nancy Finucane,
John Macevoy, Mary Anne Bunton, Mary Buckley,
Ellen Frawley, and Mary Egan. Total, 18 cases, 7
deaths. With the exception of two cases from the
lane off Thomas-street (and which proved fatal,) all
the others were from Post-office-lane and Mary-street.

One of the deaths yesterday from reputed cholera
was *not* at all of that type, the victim having died of the
effects of destitution. There has been only one death
since yesterday.

Dispensaries are formed at Munchin's, John's, and
Michael's parishes for cholera cases. Every precau-
tion that providence, skill, and experience can support
is adopted by the benevolent in this city, to meet the
disease should it become epidemic.

A cloth merchant in William-street has been robbed
by his servants of goods to the amount of £1,300.

The young men in the employment of Messrs.
William Todd & Co., gave Mr. Denis Byrne, a supper,
at the Clare Hotel, on Thursday night, (as a token of
their esteem,) previous to his departure for America.

Mr. William Anderson, once a commercial traveller
for a Dublin house, and lately connected with the
relief works of the county of Clare, died suddenly at
Ennis on Wednesday evening, whilst sitting in his
chair. Next day an inquest was held on the body by
the Coroner, Thomas Whitstone, Esq. Verdict—
Died by the visitation of God. Mr. Anderson had
only reached Ennis the day before his death, from
Limerick, where he had been residing.
