

Clare hounds meet Saturday, 28th, at Cahir Bridge; 2d May at Ballyturn; 5th, at Rockforest, the last day for the season.

In Powell v. Powell the Master of the Rolls has prohibited the creditors from proceeding at law in the superior courts upon civil bill decrees against the administratrix of the late Thomas Powell.

A fire broke out in the Court house of Ennis on Saturday night, from what cause has not been ascertained, but it was extinguished with but little detriment to the building.

William O'Hara, Esq., Recorder of Galway, opened his sessions for the borough on Monday. Ejectments entered, 14; civil bills, 50. Crown business light.

At the Town-hall Police-office, this day, before Henry Watson, Esq., informations were ordered against Henry White, for breaking the shop-window of Mr. Edward Welsh, and against Cornelius Gilligan and William Doyle, for a like offence in the shop-window of Mr. Wallis, William-street, who has sustained more loss by such acts of outrage than any other citizen. Four vagrants were ordered to the work-house; Thomas Boland and John King were fined 5s. each, for drunkenness; John Herbert, a pick-pocket, was remanded; John Feenerty, cow-stealing, sent to Doonass for examination before Sir H. D. Massy.

At the guardians meeting to-day, Alderman Wallnutt in the chair, a number of paupers from rural districts were admitted. Rev. Mr. Quade stated that two persons died while being conveyed to the work-house, owing to the neglect of relieving officers.

Colonel Mountian, 29th, was shot through the hand, by one of his pistols, when drawing it from the holster.

This afternoon, the *Thetis*, with 148 passengers, for Quebec, sailed from the quays.

Thursday morning, Patrick Barry, an itinerant pedlar, was brought into Barringtons' Hospital. Mr. Worrall, the house apothecary, at once attended him, but life was extinct, having died from starvation. The miserable creature had not tasted food for two days previously, his last meal being a plate of nettles!

Denis M'Inerney, a poor man, formerly of Murroe, was found dead this morning by the side of the road near Ballinacurra. There was no coroner to hold an inquest, and the police had him interred, by request of the Relieving-officer.

Alderman Lindsay is elected Mayor of Derry. Mr. H. Williams, master of Armagh workhouse, and twelve of the paupers, died in a few hours of cholera on Wednesday.
