The profound sensation felt in all circles at the in-
decently rude and violent treatment of two young
ladies, while shopping at an extensive establishment
in this city, will be understood from the Magisterial
investigation at the Town Hall on Saturday last, the
proceedings of which are this day reported in full,
and to which we are requested to call public attention.

The following were committed from the Town Hall
Police office, by Pierce G. Barron, Esq. on Monday.
Informations ordered against Michael M'Mahon for
sheep stealing; against Thomas M'Mullen, for larceny
of wearing apparel; against Thomas Keane, for
stealing a lamb; against Mary Mack for larceny of
turnips; Mary Lynch, suspicion of robbery, remand-
ed; Michael Foster, breaking glass, 14 days at hard
labour; John Magrath, Pilot, and proprietor of a
lodging house on Arthur's quay, accused of stealing
3 sovereigns from a sailor, was recommended to refund
the money.

Yesterday morning, a countryfellow dashed a huge
stone against the engine of the Waterford and Lime-
rick railway train passing nigh Pallas, which struck
the machine with violence. The Engineer reduced
his speed quick as possible, and one of the railway
police pursued the offender, whom he overtook, and
they brought him in a prisoner to this city. His name
is John Lynch.

Patrick Murphy, convict under sentence of 7 years
transportation, at Quarter Sessions, died in the city
gaol on Monday morning.

The sentence of transportation on several misdemean-
ants is to be commuted to imprisonment.

Monday last, as Patrick Hogan, fisherman, of
Castle-Connell, was following his occupation, with cot
and rod, in those celebrated waters, his salmon fly
bait was pulled with great violence, and the angler
considering he had hooked a noble fish, gave play with
the line, holding on with a steady hand and vigilant
eye. He was thus engaged for an hour and a-half,
when the supposed fish relaxed his efforts, and Hogan
pulled for the last time, drawing alongside his cot,
not a huge salmon, but a veritable Otter, pinned by
the paw, and still struggling to release himself. The
amphibious creature was landed, to the surprise of all
present, and was brought to town yesterday.

At the fishery case prosecution, before the Magis-
trates last Petty Sessions, Mr. Worrall, Civil Engi-
neer, describing the locality of the weir, said the river
was there 1,222 feet wide, or near quarter of a mile.

The barque *Mary Ann Henry*, and brigantine *Fame*,
both in port, were offered for sale by auction, on
Monday, but as the tenders did not come up to the
estimated value, the vessels were bought in.

The following emigrant ships cleared out from this
port on Monday and yesterday:—*Wilberforce*, for
New-York, 108 passengers; *Leviathan*, for Quebec,
133 passengers; and *Energy*, for Quebec, 160 pas-
sengers—and this day the *Maria Brennan*, for New
York, with 90 passengers.

by railway train, for Dublin, to embark *via* Liverpool
for the United States, taking a great quantity of
