

Savings Bank books, Dublin.

The Earl and Countess Seafield are daily expected in this city to attend the wedding of his lordship's son, the Hon. Lewis Grant, late of the Life Guards, with Miss Maunsell, daughter of the late Robert George Maunsell, Esq.

The merchants of Limerick are beginning to ship for the English and Scottish markets the large quantity of grain held in store since last winter. The near prospect of an early and plentiful harvest induces them to make a clearance of the reserved stock. The exports in the last week amounted to 3000 barrels of wheat for Liverpool, and 1147 barrels oats for Glasgow, with 5,995 firkins of butter for London.

Five vessels arrived in this port yesterday with "bread stuffs" from foreign ports.

A partial blight of the wheat crop in this county is reported, from the ravages of the maggot, the larvæ of a fly called the wheat midge. We trust the injury is not material.

Two labourers, named Thomas Long and Thomas Hartigan, employed at the new Floating-docks, were drowned on yesterday, by the upsetting of a boat in which they left the raft where they were working, and the over-loaded boat, containing 16 persons, had just touched the shore, when in the act of landing, the melancholy accident took place, and they were all precipitated into the water. The body of Thomas Long was found immediately after the sad accident, and that of Thomas Hartigan subsequently.

Denis Corbett, the runaway clerk of J. N. Russell & Sons, who was pursued to Quebec and arrested there, was landed yesterday from the *Elizabeth*, a vessel belonging to the firm, in which he came home a prisoner, and followed by a multitude of people from the quays, who knew the man well, and the robbery committed on his benefactors, was escorted to the City gaol by a strong guard of Police.

The rage of emigration to America has amazingly cooled down for the last month. In this port several intending emigrants of the farmer classes have forfeited their deposits to the ship brokers, in consequence of the continued favourable growth of the present Potato crop, which was the last three years an almost hopeless experiment.

There have been occasional violent heavy showers of rain since Sunday last, but the visitation was not general, and no harm is done the crops. The fresh breezy weather which followed soon relieved the standing corn of any danger from permanent moisture. Early wheat will be cutting in parts of this county next week.

A large bundle of funeral linen belonging to the St. St. Patrick's Temperance Society, Clare-street, was feloniously abstracted, and traced to a pawn-office on Saturday, where only 5s. was lent thereon.
