ing up on Saturday, unanimously adopted an address of congratulation to the Queen on the occasion of her visit to this country.

The address from the County Waterford was moved by Lord Stuart de Decies, seconded by the Marquis of Waterford. The address to Prince Albert was moved by Lord Carew, and seconded by the Earl of Huntingdon. Both addresses passed unanimously.

The Clonmel corporation address to the Queen prays for pardon of the State prisoners and Repeal of the Union.

The directors of the General Post-office are making arrangements to compel each householder in every town throughout Ireland to have a letter-box in his door or window, for the purpose of expediting the delivery of letters by the carriers.

Sir Nicholas Fitzsimon, Inspector-General of Prisons, and formerly member for the King's County, expired at his seat, Broughall-Castle, on the 31st July, after an illness of eight days, from apoplexy.

Dr. Quin, physician to the Nenagh gaol, and Mr. Michael Harty, the apothecary, have been removed from their situations by the grand jury. The reason of their services being dispensed with is their having been contractors to the prison for the supply of milk, contrary to act of parliament and gaol regulations. The election for the vacant situations took place in the grand jury room. The candidates for physician were Drs. Frith and Kittson. The first named was elected by a majority of two votes, the numbers being—for Dr. Frith 11, and for Surgeon Kittson 9. Mr. Cahalan was elected apothecary in room of Mr. Harty.

The hearing of appeals against the valuation of Mr. Griffith within the Municipal boundary of Kilkenny, took place in the Grand Jury room of the County Court Court, the sub-Commissioners being Messrs. Robert Purdon, and Edward Gafaney. Mr. N. Loughnan stated that in Patrick-street several houses which had formerly let at from £60 to £70 per annum, lately became unoccupied, and some were re-set at from £20 to £25. For some still untenanted £30 would be gladly taken. The Sub-Commissioners will continue their sittings three days.

On Saturday last, Dr. Enright, coroner, held an inquest on the remains of Joseph Kennedy who was killed a few days before while raising sand in a gravel pit, the bank falling in on him. The jury returned a verdict of accidental death.

On Monday night last a dwelling-house and office, belonging to Thomas Malone, near CloghJordan, was maliciously set fire to and consumed to ashes. The cause assigned for this outrage was that Malone was one of the men that had the courage to plough the land for Lord Dunalley, that Meara was evicted from.

At the Carrickfergus assizes on Saturday, Mr. Justice Perrin fined a juror £50 for refusing to serve in the case of a man named Thompson, charged with the murder of his wife by administering arsenic to her. The juror was a Quaker gentleman named John Wardle, and his reason for not serving was because he had a conscientious objection to sit on a trial involving the life or death of a fellow-creature.
