TRANSMISSION OF CONVICTS TO SPIKE ISLAND.—
Pursuant to an order from Dublin Castle, the fol-
lowing convicts were yesterday morning transmitted
from the county gaol to Spike Island, via railway, in
charge of Sub-Inspector Channer, of Adare, and an
escort of constabulary:—For life—James O'Brien,
Patrick Walsh, William Collins, and John Wall. For
15 years—Martin Halloran, John Doherty, John
Cahill, Michael Hayes, Patrick Healy, John Mahony,
John Duhigg, and Maurice Quinlivan. For 7 years—
Morty Leahy, John Leahy, James Leahy, John Mo-
lony, Thomas Murphy, Thomas Fitzgerald, John
Hayes, Michael Kelly, John Donegan, Denis Connell,
Patrick Feane, James Harley, Michael Hayes. On
Monday morning 25 others are to be transmitted.

On Thursday, 25 male convicts from Ennis gaol, in
charge of a party of Constabulary, under Sub-Inspector
Donovan, arrived here *en route* to Spike Island, and
left by railway same day.

On Thursday morning a young boy named Thady
Connell, in the temporary employ of a gentleman
residing at Corbally, near this City, hanged himself
under extraordinary circumstances. It appeared the
lad had witnessed the execution of the three unfortu-
nate criminals, Catherine Dillon, John Fogarty, and
John Frewen, the Saturday previous, in front of the
County gaol, and was frequently heard to say on that
and the following days—"I would much like to know
how people feel when they are hanging." No notice
was taken of the silly remark; but the boy, (who had
also purchased from an itinerant ballad singer, what
is denominated a lamentation) to gratify curiosity,
resolved to try the experiment, and having secretly
entered a barn, procured a dog chain to which a
leather collar was attached, and adding a piece of
rope, constructed a noose, which he placed around
his neck, he flung himself off from a manger, and was
found a corpse by the first that entered! Dr. Enright,
coroner, held an inquest yesterday, when a verdict of
accidental death was returned.

The pocket of Caleb Going, Esq. was picked of
£150 and that of B. Frend, Esq. of £18, in the crowd
at Kingstown, on Friday, when the Queen was em-
barking.
