

violence of his prison associates were his name to be published; we refrain from doing so. Two of the City Police, named Herbert and Jones, patients in the County Infirmary (opposite the prison), were the first to assist the Governor, having left their sick beds on hearing the alarm bell ring.

There are 137 transport convicts in the county gaol, supported at the expense of the public, when they should have been removed to their destination long ago. The peace of the prison must be in jeopardy with such an able phalanx, ripe at all hours for mischief, and whose constant study it is to baffle the officers of the gaol.

It is remarkable that the convicts in Ennis gaol, numbering 182, broke out in the most violent manner also on Sunday; they scattered their bread and offered violence to the keepers; but the activity displayed by the turnkeys, led by Mr. Darcy, the Governor, soon subdued the malecontents, many of whom were well beaten, and others left without supper on that night, and diminished diet on Monday.

A carpenter named Malone, who resided on Merchant's-quay, well-known in this city as "undertaker," has absconded to America with the wife of a tanner named Scott. Malone abandoned his wife and five children—the frail paramour, deserted her husband, and three young ones.

John Houlahan, a native of Adare, was the stone mason killed last week in the drunken row, which took place at the terminus of the Great Southern and Western railway, Cork.

NEWCASTLE PETTY SESSIONS.—On the Bench, Lord Muskerry, John C. Locke, and Thomas D'Arcy Evans, Esqrs. John Hanly was fined £5 or 3 months in gaol, for assaulting James Mangan; Thomas Keeffe, 10s. fine, and 10s. costs, for an assault on John Kennedy; Jeremiah Noonan, fined £5 or two months, for wilfully and maliciously breaking down a fence, and taking away stones on the road at Fehonagh; Thomas Butler and John Shea, 3 months, with hard labour, for deserting their wives; informations were ordered against William Flynn, Daniel Minahan, and John O'Neill, for breaking into the store at the Newcastle workhouse, and stealing clothes; against Thomas Conway, for having unlicensed fire-arms.

On Sunday a large party collected on the lands of Doonane, near Bushfield, and cut down, dug and carried away all the corn and potatoes that grew upon a farm lately held by a person named Magrath.

At Newport petty sessions on Friday all the persons concerned in abstracting the crops from Shallee were fined 5s cost, at the prosecution of Mr. O'Meara, the landlord.
