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At the Town Hall Police office, yesterday, Thomas Dwyer, labourer, from Rhebogue, was charged with an aggravated assault, with intent to violate the person of Mary Arthur, a married female, on the banks of the Canal, when returning from the city on Sunday evening, after making sale of milk. Informations were ordered against the prisoner; Thomas Walsh, assault on sub Constable Rutlin, was fined 5s.

At the Town-hall, this day, three drukkards, disturbing the streets, were fined 5s. each.

On Monday morning, 97 prisoners left the County gaol, under a strong escort of Police, in charge of sub Inspector Enright and Head Constable Daly, for Rathkeale, to be tried at the present Quarter Sessions of the district. A serious accident occurred near Patrick's-well, one of the horses attached to a car upon which seven females were seated, having taken fright, and dashed violently against the wall at the road side, precipitating the driver (Cooney) and five of the women over a high ditch. Two of the females were badly injured, and had to be taken to the house of Dr. Peat, at Patrick's-well, where their wounds were dressed. The driver had his skull fractured, and received bruises from the effects of which he was for some time insensible.

DEATHS BY DROWNING—THREE LIVES LOST.—A melancholy accident occurred in the river Maigue, nearly opposite Melon House, the seat of Mrs. Montiford Westropp, on Sunday. It appears that at eight o'clock that morning Mr. A. Vianello, master of the Austrian barque *Paolino*, of Venice, accompanied by his brother, and Mr. George Hewson, interpreter to M. R. Ryan, Esq., foreign consul of this port, left this city for Grass Island, where the ship, (which arrived with Indian corn, consigned to T. M. Usborne, Esq.,) was at anchor. Soon after the jolly-boat was manned to convey the three to Ballybrown chapel to hear mass, a pilot named Greene, from Grass Island, being one of the crew. Having, when tacking, missed stays, the boat ran upon a mud bank, and could not be got off until polled—she wore ship, the sails gibed, and upset her in deep water. The consequence was, that the entire, *eight* persons, were suddenly immersed in water, a strong current then running in the channel, towards which all drifted. Mr. Hewson held on by the boat until the last prospect of aid failed, and he therefore determined to swim ashore, a distance of near a quarter of a mile, which he accomplished. Two sailors reached the slob in safety with Geovanni Antonio Deacovich, master of the Austrian barque, *Sono Fratelli*, who accompanied the party. Capt. Vianello, with his brother, Francisco, perished—also a seaman, whose name is not yet known. They clung to the boat until strength failed, when they disappeared.—The body of the seaman (who had £40 on board) was picked up same evening, but the Captain and his brother have not yet been found.
