The bill in this cause was filed in Chancery by the plaintiff, claiming as personal representative of the Rev. John Young, formerly rector of the parish of Killishill, to be entitled to a sum of £1,175, which the Rev. John Young had paid to the executrix of the Rev. Daniel Kelly, his immediate predecessor, as a building charge upon the said parish for the erection of a glebe house on a new site by the Rev. Danl. Kelly. Several sequestrations had been issued at the suit of creditors of the Rev. Richard Nugent Horner, the present incumbent of the parish, and a bill had also been filed by a person named Casey, who had obtained a charge under deed by way of annuity from the defendant, Horner, to which the plaintiff Brooke was not a party, and a decree was pronounced in that cause declaring Casey's annuity a charge on the said parish.

There had been considerable litigation between the respective creditors of the defendant, Horner, as to the priority in which they should be paid, and upon the hearing of the cause instituted by Brooke in the rights aforesaid, to which all the creditors of Horner were parties, the Lord Chancellor declared his opinion to be that the plaintiff, Brooke, was entitled, under the statutes referred to in the argument, to a first charge upon one full moiety of the parish of Killishill, in priority over all other charges, and that such charge was in his opinion a legal charge.

As the suit had been instituted for the purpose of asserting the priority of Brooke as a first incumbrancer upon the parish, which had been questioned and disputed by Casey, the annuitant creditor, a decree was arranged by consent, in conformity with the declaration of the Chancellor.

SUDDEN DEATH.—Yesterday, John E. Hyndman, Esq., one of the city coroners, held an inquest at the Railway Terminus, King's-bridge, on the body of Stephen Gleeson, Esq. The deceased, who was 78 years old, had on Sunday morning driven from his seat, near Hospital, county Limerick, to the Knock-long railway station, where, accompanied by his two daughters, he took his passage in the ten o'clock train for Dublin. The train had not proceeded far when he complained of extreme weakness, and resting his head on the shoulder of one of his daughters, Mrs. Barry, he almost immediately expired. The body remained in the train till its arrival in Dublin the same afternoon.—Surgeon White examined the body, and stated his opinion that the deceased had died from spasm of the heart. The jury found a verdict of death by visitation of God.
