Lord John Russell moved on Monday the second
 reading of the Parliamentary oaths abolition bill, with
 a view to admit Jews to the Legislature. The motion
 was carried by a majority of 93.

LIMERICK UNION.—The Guardians held their
 weekly meeting to-day, Alderman Wallnutt in the
 chair. Complaints were made of the discourtesy
 evinced by some of the relieving officers towards mem-
 bers of the board who had given tickets to destitute
 persons, and an order was made that they attend next
 Wednesday to explain their conduct. Letters were
 read from the Rev. Messrs. Quade and O'Connor, re-
 presenting the awful extent of destitution, and stating
 that deaths from starvation are so frequent that
 strenuous exertions should be made to save the lives of
 hundreds of famishing creatures who could neither be
 admitted to the workhouse, or get out-door relief ! It
 was arranged that out-door relief should be given, in
 food, on an extensive scale. The return of
 industrial employment at which the paupers are
 engaged was very satisfactory. A letter from
 Sir Richard de Burgho, forwarded to the Com-
 missioners, was read, claiming to be placed on the list
 of ex-officio guardians—Weekly report.—Paupers ad-
 mitted, 425 ; discharged, 328 ; died, 62 ; remaining
 this day, 5,626 ; weekly cost of each, 1s. 3d.

Twelve hundred applicants sought admission to the
 Union Workhouse yesterday, but more than half that
 number were refused, for want of room, the establish-
 ments being over-crowded.

At the Town-hall Police-office, this day, John Fahy,
