On Sunday night, Constable Michael Falvey, of the
Newcastle station, arrested a notorious character

day, at the County Infirmery, the unfortunate man
underwent amputation of the mangled limb.

On Yesterday an inquest was held at the County In-
firmery, before James Bennett, Esq., on the body of
a recently born female child, found dead in the bed of
a patient in that institution, named Ellen Sullivan. It
did not appear in evidence, when or where the woman
was delivered, for up to the time of the discovery of
the infant she had positively denied having been con-
fined, although repeatedly interrogated on the subject.
The face of the child was distorted, apparently as if the
hand had been pressed on the mouth and nose, so as
to prevent respiration. The Jury after examination
of Dr. Griffin, and Surgeon Parker, found against the
mother for having concealed the child's birth, and the
Coroner issued his warrant accordingly. It was thought
that when the woman offered herself for admission at
the hospital, she was under dropsical affection!
