made in the laws affecting the importation of corn
and other provisions, with a view to petition the legis-
lature for their modification.”
The landed proprietors and occupiers of the North
Riding of Tipperary have addressed a requisition to
Sir John C. Carden, the High Sheriff, for a public
meeting at Nenagh, to petition Parliament, “to take
into their serious and immediate consideration the
depressed state of agricultural property, and to de-
mand some alteration or modification in the present
corn law.”
The Queen's County is preparing a requisition to its
two county members, the Hon. Mr. Vesey and the
Rt. Hon. J. W. Fitzpatrick, either to support the
agriculture of Ireland, or to resign their seats.
There are complaints from Clare of the supineness of
land owners and occupiers in that County, who have
not followed the right example of their brethren in the
County Limerick, by inquiries and returns as to the
comparative amount of tillage, produce, and general
taxation, which it is alleged would present even a more
disheartening contrast, and therefore demands an
effort from those interested in the welfare of the Clare
farmer. Statistical returns like those from Limerick,
duly authenticated from every county in Ireland, if
laid before Parliament at the ensuing session by Irish
representatives in the Lords and Commons, would
establish a ground for inquiry and redress which no
Cabinet could withstand.
