The landed proprietors and occupiers of the North Riding of Tipperary have addressed a requisition to Sir John C. Carden, the High Sheriff, for a public meeting at Nenagh, to petition Parliament, " to take into their serious and immediate consideration the depressed state of agricultural property, and to demand some alteration or modification in the present corn law."
