LIMERICK HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS.—The Mayor
presided at the weekly meeting of the Board on Thurs-
day; the other members present were Fras. Spaight,
Stephen Roche, Thomas Worrall, Robert Rodger, John
Mullock, and Michael R. Ryan, Esqrs. A letter from
the Board of Works was laid before the meeting, re-
commending that the erection of a privy at the bonding
yard be deferred 'till a fitter site is procured, as the
bonding yard will hereafter be required for important
objects. The Harbour Master was directed to fill up
an excavation at Russell's-quay—also to repair the
quay at lower end of Francis-street, which the Parish
Commissioners declined doing.

The Mayor, as a mark of respect to the memory of
his lamented predecessor, has determined not to display
any insignia of office till the expiration of the present
year. He has sent coals, &c. to the charitable insti-
tutions in the city.

John Meehan, a poor, sickly man, from John's
parish, fell on Wednesday night in Denmark-street,
overcome by the extreme cold and destitution. He
was removed to hospital, and expired before morning.
Yesterday an inquest was held by Dr. Enright, coroner,
when it appeared he died the victim of starvation!

It is a melancholy fact that never has our City
exhibited such little appearance of the bustle of busi-
ness on the eve of Christmas. Neither victuallers,
bakers, grocers, or provision merchants, will realise
one-fourth by the sales to which they were accustomed
at this period of the year.

Severe frost has set in, and is likely to continue,
after the heavy rains. The air is sharp, dry, and
bracing, with fog morning and evening. This weather
is favourable to health, and will be advantageous to
farmers, who will soon commence ploughing and
digging the ground for seed wheat, a work entirely
abandoned for the last fortnight or three weeks.

At Wallace's Observatory, George's-street, the
Thermometer was 5 degrees below the freezing point
on Thursday night. The height of the barometer
this morning (Saturday) at 10, was 30.650 inches.

Carts laden with sheet Ice, more than an inch thick,
