The deputation from the Corporation of Kilkenny

on the body by George Bradshaw, Esq. when the fol-
lowing verdict was returned—"That the deceased died
in the barn of George Devine, of dropsy, accelerated
by exposure to wet and cold."

Thursday night a daring robbery was committed in
the house of Mr John Toohey, Toomevara. Toohey
and his family went to bed at 11 o'clock, and fastened
the door of his shop. Toohey heard ns noise until
nine o'clock the morning, when he heard the front
door slap. He immediately got out of bed, and found
that he was robbed of 14s. 6d. in silver, a stone of
sugar, 1 lb of tea, a quantity of coffee, and bread. On
closely examining he found that the thief had come
down through the chimney of the house.

Thursday evening a ruffian threw a stone through the
window of Mr. J. Harvey, in Dublin-street, Clonmel,
and broke several articles of glass and china ware.
