Witnesses deposed that application was made to the relieving officer for meal, which he refused. Dr. Ambrose made a post mortem examination on the body, and found in the stomach some turnip water and a spoonful of something resembling curds. The jury returned a verdict

that Timothy Madden died from the effects of starvation, caused by insufficiency of food, and attributed to the neglect of John Riedy, relieving efficer.— On Sunday Francis Graham, Esq., Sub-Inspector, arrested Riedy, under the Coroner's warrant, to take his trial at the assizes, and subsequently Riedy was admitted to bail by John Courtnay Locke, Esq.

James Bennett, Esq., Coroner, held an inquest at Bruff on Friday, on the body of an unknown man. The poor man was found lying insensible in a stable belonging to Dr. Bennett, whose servant had him removed to the Bruff temporary fever hospital, and Dr. Bennett promptly applied restoratives, but to no avail, as the patient died in three hours. The jury returned

a verdict—"We find that an unknown man came by his death in consequence of want of food." He was not a native of the Kilmallock union, but it is said he belonged to the union of Rathkeale, and that a ticket of admission to the workhouse was found in his pocket.
