At Ennis Assizes, Sergeant Stock reversed the
crees of the Assistant Barrister, and decided that
graziers were not responsible for the loss of stock sent
upon their lands.

Pierse Newport Barron, Esq., has resigned the grand
jury cess collectorship for the city Waterford.

Mr. Denis Gallwey, son of the late officer, is elected
High Constable of Ibane barony, Cork; Mr. S. New-
enham for the barony of Kinnalea, and Mr. J. T.
Wakeham for Cork barony.

The prisoners in Cork county gaol mutinied on
Thursday, breaking the tables and forms, when the
police and military were called in to subdue the re-
volt, and the leaders were placed in irons.

There are 60 prisoners for trial at Galway county
assizes, and ten in the town.

Patrick Maher, for the violation of Alice Keily, was
sentenced at Waterford to transportation for life.

At Mullingar assizes four men were tried and ac-
quitted of conspiracy to murder Mr. Daniel. William
Vize, Esq., for the murder of Thomas Flynn, with a
gun-shot wound, at Dysart, the seat of Captain Ogle,
was also acquitted. Mr. Vize is married to a niece of
the late Captain Ogle, who left his estate to him, and
Captain Ogle's two nephews claiming title thereto,
invaded the premises with their followers when the fatal
shot was fired.

Judge Ball will preside in the record court at Clon-
mel, and Nenagh, Judge Torrens, in the crown court.

Twenty convicts, under rule of transportation,
arrived at Spike Island, on Thursday, from Tralee
gaol.

Charles Stennett, of the schooner, *Union of London*,
when engaged lowering the anchor from a small boat,
at the Pool, on Thursday, was dragged over the gun-
wale by a coil of the rope, into the river, and unfortu-
nately drowned. His body was found soon after.

The Governors of the Limerick District Asylum were
obliged to purchase in the meat market this week, in
consequence of their contractor not supplying to the
institution prime beef and mutton.

Dr. Enright, coroner, held an inquest at Mary-st.
on Thursday, on the body of Thomas Hurley, who was
found dead in a cellar on Tuesday. Verdict—"Died
for want of the common necessaries of life."

Dr. Enright held an inquest on Wednesday in the
church yard of Templeatay, on the body of Mary
O'Connor, who was interred that day four weeks. It
was alleged that she died from the effects of a blow of
a spade-tree given by her husband, and that she was
privately buried at night. The body was exhumed
and carefully examined by Dr. Taylor. There being
no marks of violence apparent, and no evidence to
prove the allegation, the jury found a verdict that
deceased died from fever and dysentery.

A proposition to dispense with the duties of coroner
will be entertained by the Kerry grand jury.
